The essence of good ethical conduct and practice is summarised in the form below. By adopting these guidelines, the club accepts that all its members have a duty of care towards young and vulnerable members.

Codes of Conduct for Coaches & Helpers

All Club Coaches and Helpers must:

- Consider the well-being and safety of participants before the development of performance.
- Develop an appropriate working relationship with performers, based on mutual trust and respect.
- Make sure all activities are appropriate to the age, ability and experience of those taking part.
- Promote the positive aspects of the sport (e.g. fair play).
- Display consistently high standards of behaviour and appearance.
- Follow all guidelines laid down by BADMINTON England and the club.
- Hold appropriate, valid qualifications and insurance cover.
- Never exert undue influence over performers to obtain personal benefit or reward.
- Never condone rule violations, rough play or the use of prohibited substances.
